1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The health and safety of the WASD students, staff and visitors remains, as always, the top priority for the organization. The WASD Administration continues to take critical steps and make decisions that protect the health and safety of our organization in the ongoing response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We will continue to consider the mandates and recommendations issued by the Governor's Office, the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH), the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE). The WASD Administration will continue to monitor communications. As conditions change related to COVID-19, protocols are subject to change.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

WASD educational programs are planning for a return to full in-person instruction (5 days per week) in the fall of 2021, pending any unexpected change in mandates from PDE / DOH.

Based on results from surveying parents of students enrolled in WAVE during the 2020-21 school year, we understand that a small number of families may be interested in continuing a full virtual program for their student. Based on this priority, it is not feasible to provide 6-feet of physical distancing at all times for students. Physical distancing to the maximum extent feasible will continue to be recommended for indoor and outdoor spaces.</li> <li>Building administration may implement and revise procedures to increase physical distancing in classrooms and other school settings.</li> <li>Plexiglass dividers will continue to be available in WASD educational spaces to support distancing between students and employees.</li> <li>Handshakes, high-fives, etc. should be avoided.</li> <li>Vehicle drivers will maintain daily seating charts and attendance records.</li> <li>The Facilities Director, JSHS Administration and Athletic Director will work with WASD coaches and outside organizations that wish to use District facilities to share contents of this plan and ensure the identified practices of the plan are implemented or contained in submitted plans.</li> <li>Teachers of performing arts may have recommendations for face coverings/ shields for use during chorus, orchestra band, theatre, etc. activities.</li> <li>WASD students and staff who travel for field trips, training or extra-curricular activities must follow the Health Plan strategies of the host facility or private transportation provider.</li> </ul>

Handwashing and respiratory etiquette;	<ul> <li>Students and employees will be encouraged to wash/sanitize hands frequently.</li> <li>Signage will continue to be posted in WASD buildings.</li> <li>Hand sanitizer and gloves will be available in classrooms and other areas used by students.</li> <li>Instruction will be provided to students and employees regarding best practices for covering a cough or sneeze.</li> </ul>

Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation;	<ul> <li>WASD will continue to implement best practices developed in response to COVID-19 for keeping the workplace clean, disinfected, and safe for staff, students, and visitors. Additional cleaning and disinfecting measures / protocols may be required as deemed appropriate or directed by DOH depending on circumstances.</li> <li>Staff will continue to be expected to adhere to appropriate personal protective equipment guidelines.</li> <li>Cleaning materials including wipes and spray bottles will continue to be available in all rooms and offices.</li> <li>Ventilation systems will continue to be run additional hours to provide additional fresh air.</li> <li>The HVAC system will also be used to help filter the air in our buildings.</li> <li>Limiting shared materials and use of items that cannot be easily cleaned will continue.</li> <li>Students and staff will continue to be expected to share in the cleaning and disinfecting of shared equipment and / or furniture / items within one's office / classroom.</li> <li>The Facilities Director will continue to use contracted services to support WASD custodial staff as needed to</li> </ul>

implement daily cleaning activities.Vehicles used to transport students will

	be cleaned daily.
e. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and guarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	<ul> <li>The PA DOH considers COVID-19 a communicable disease. It is among DOH's list of reportable diseases. As such, WASD will follow Board policy related to communicable diseases (policy 203)</li> <li>Students, employees and visitors will self-monitor for symptoms and will refrain from attending school/work if individual has symptoms or combinations of symptoms in the attached "Should I Send My Child to School" or "Should I Go to Work" chall Parents/Guardians of students are required to immediately report to the school nurse if their child had an exposure outside of school, has been tested for COVID-19 and/or has been identified as positive for COVID-19.</li> <li>Employees are required to report to the immediate supervisor if they have had an exposure outside of work, have be tested for COVID-19 and/or have bee identified as positive for COVID-19.</li> <li>Individuals who become ill while at school/school activities/work will be isolated from other individuals. If the individual is a student, the parent or guardian will be contacted immediate</li> <li>The Director of Pupil Services, in collaboration with WASD School Nurs and DOH, is authorized to restrict individuals from attending school/worl and is authorized to assign quaranting individuals as needed.</li> <li>The Director of Pupil Services and WASD School Nurses will work with employees, parents/guardians, medic personnel and DOH to follow DOH guidance regarding restriction or quarantine.</li> </ul>
