The Institute for Community Inclusion has been a leader in the area of postsecondary education for people with intellectual and other developmental disabilities for over 10 years. participation of individuals with disabilities by conducting a national survey of existing postsecondary options and an analysis of national databases to learn more about the impact postsecondary educational opportunities have on people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
